Expectations for Student Council Officers

Student Council Officers are representative of the student body, both inside and outside of the school. All officers must maintain a C average. Additionally, if any officer is given a Code Notice, or comes into trouble outside of school, then that student will be removed from the office.

Student Council Election Process

The election process will start with a mandatory information meeting. Any student who does not show up to the mandatory meeting may not run for an office. The student will be asked to join Student Council as an Ambassador.

Students will be given a permission slip with room for three teacher signatures, a parent/guardian signature, and important dates. The permission slips must be handed in on the exact due date, with the appropriate signatures.

On the day of the election, the candidates will give speeches to the students in grades 4 - 7. The speeches will be a school-only affair, meaning that guests will not be invited to listen to the speeches. After the speeches have been given, the students will go to their classrooms and vote. Any ballot that has been written on, or any incomplete ballots, will not be counted. There will not be any absentee ballots. The students who vote must hear the candidates' speeches in order to make an informed decision. The speeches will not be videotaped, nor will the videos be made available to any absent student. St. Luke School will not put videos of candidates on line.

In the event of a tie, the homeroom teachers in grades 4 - 7 will be asked to vote for the tied office.

All results are final. This is a healthy, grade school competition. We teach our students to celebrate other students' victories, and to graciously accept defeat.
